



## What is a Citizens' Police Academy?

The Citizen's Academy is designed to provide the community of Chesterfield Township with a hands on learning environment in the law enforcement profession. It is the goal of the Citizen's Academy to familiarize each participant with the knowledge, skills, and tactics needed to be a successful Law Enforcement Officer.

## Who can Attend?

The Citizen's Academy is free of charge and open to all Chesterfield Township residents and business owners, over the age of 18.

Participants can not have any felony convictions or have any misdemeanor convictions within the last four (4) years. All applicants will be subject to a background investigation and will need to sign a liability waiver. Selected applicants will be notified in writing by the Chief of Police.

## How Long Is The Academy?

The Academy class will meet once a week for 3 hours and run for 10 weeks total. Classes will take place at the station, except for occasional off site classes. Those will take place at the Macomb Police Academy. The 10th week of training will consist of a graduation ceremony, which is open for family member's to attend.
